Remembering Mr Rautela!

As a young boarder in Sainik School Chittorgarh (SSC), an immaculately dressed teacher in a tweed coat, wide maroon tie, worsted trousers, well polished tan brown leather shoes, and perfectly groomed hair with a straight neat side parting, made a lasting impression on my heart, and mind. He walked taking, longer strides than his not so tall frame would allow. His gait had a little lunge, and we usually saw him invariably carrying charts rolled up into long batons. I soon knew his name was Mr Mohan Singh Rautella. In SSC, teachers were called Masters. I loved the idea because it is redolent of aspartame tradition. Mr Rautella was indeed a Master and an institution in himself as I went on to learn more of him during my journey in the school. It was January 1968, then.

He was to teach us Geography and we were in class V (A). He began his first class: The Solar System is family of Sun and it consists of nine planets. A lesson that remains etched in my mind so vividly, even after half a century. As time peddled I grew closer to him, may be one of his favourite students. My love for Geography as a subject grew all because of this great teacher. I managed distinction in Geography when the results of our Higher Secondary Examinations got revealed.

Mr Rautela hailed from hilly region of Kumaon, near Almora, in the present day Utrakhand, and got raised in a very humble family. His elder brother was his mentor and fostered his education up to MSc in Geology. He learnt to be austere and severely self disciplined, knowing well the pains his elder brother took to fund his expenses. Once he told us during a usual chat on the dining table that he hasn't allowed bad cold to catch him since 1954 (or so). He advised us, "Never expose yourself to sudden cold temperatures. The body resistance falls once it

has to abruptly adapt to newer temperatures, and that's how we get cold." He would never use and allow fans during rains. Once, I had escorted my younger brother to school (SSC) and then I was already a Captain in Infantry. Mr Rautela insisted that I stay with him for the night in his quarters. I agreed sheepishly, knowing the regimen he runs. It was July and it had rained in the evening. After a sumptuous meal that he fed me with, delightfully cooked mutton by him and some lovely kheer by Mrs Rautela we retired to bed. He cautioned me not use fan else I would catch cold. Acting smart, I quietly switched in on thinking the Master gone to sleep. But, No he quietly came in and switched off the fan soon enough. He knew me well.

He insisted always that we eat a balanced diet and never go overboard seeing a delicious food or starve when food is not of your liking. He said "I always eat four chapatis and a humble helping of rice, irrespective of the spread on the table. No more no less." Also he gave us a mantra that never drink water up till 45 minutes of finishing eating. Padam Singh still follows it. His physical fitness levels were pretty high and he boast about absolutely flat abs. At that time his age must be around 50 years, then. An outstanding sportsman he was, who played demonstrative soccer and a toughest racquet to beat on tennis courts. He would be seen playing with boys often during games period and coached footballers.

Mr Rautela taught Geography with an ease of a Buddha. He was so widely travelled that his physical experience of the place would electrify the dull subjects like 'Chhota Nagpur Plateau and its oranges, or its high temperatures in summers.' We learnt Indian Railways network better, through his travelogues on many routes. Though, he couldn't afford travelling abroad, he

read so much about Europe, its military history. Mr Rautela, was much inclined and enthused by Military life and it's romance. He got fascinated by Field Marshal Bernard Montgomery of Alamein and battles of WWII. No wonder he named his son Monty, the nick name of the Field Marshal. He would take us (the boys of Geography Club) to a nearby hillock, or railway bridge on River Bedach to play mock tactical platoon battles. He couldn't, of course, join Armed Forces because of age. He started late schooling.

Austerity, he practiced was exemplary. He showed us an old geometry box (Camel remembers) bought to him by his elder brother sometimes in early forties. It was intact in a brand new condition including its paper cover inside. He said nothing gets damage by its usage but because of misuse. Sure enough Monty broke it within a month once he gave it to him. He rode an old Raleigh bicycle which could sure be a vintage category then. He preserved his clothes with such a conscientious care that they remained ever glistening like new. I distinctly remember his favourite tweed from Lallmly, a famous brand for wool and woollens from Kanpur.

Parikshit Bishnoi, our class fellow and favourite student of Mr Rautela, once narrated me a very heart warming incident. On the dining table once, as Parikshit took his first morsel in mouth an expression of distaste shot up on his face. Mr Rautela, sitting at the head of the table, just

pushed the dish of salt towards Parikshit. How intimately he knew his wards, we were not only his pupils. Parikshit had only 'Thanks Sir' to say and used a pinch of salt to fix the daal he was to savour.

Mr Rautela would walk into the class and bisect the board vertically with a chalk line into two halves. A practice never seen anywhere else. Then he would write a strange word and no one would know it's meaning. He would go on meticulously to introduce a new word to us and the best part was he taught me a new word when I met him during an OBA Meet in 2007. Now, an app Dictionary, on my iPad fires a new word every day in notifications. It reminds me so nostalgically about him.

Today, on 30th day of December 2018 we closed the chapter called Rautela Sahab, an era came to its end. Mr. Mohan Singh Rautela lived his life fruitfully and left us with utmost dignity of a Godly soul. The vacuum he left can never be filled. When I say some like Mr Rautela are indispensable, I have all my conviction and commitment behind it. What Mr Rautela contributed to the society in his selfless service to education for 50 years is a feat few will acclaim. His presence in me shall remain unmoved and continue to guide me for rest of my life.

Tomorrow at 6.00 AM, the BBC news will be broadcasted, but Mr Rautela will be not there to hear. It will be a mournful day after half a century.

MY School, MY Pride

Amidst race of making businessmen, engineers, doctors, IT professionals..., Sainik School, Chittorgarh is a cut above the rest for being a cradle of warriors, commanders and camaraderie. While a public school races for soaring percentiles, we at this school ingrain patriotism in its most despotic dimension. Primarily rose as a feeder institution to National Defence Academy, Pune on 7th August, 1961, the school shoulders onus of preparing boys academically, physically and mentally for entry into the same through military training imparted on daily basis.

Nestled in backdrop of Chittorgarh fort on land of (Meera) devotion and (Rajputana) sacrifice, the entry into the school remains a dream for hundreds of humble boys who enroll in this school to become officers in Indian Defence forces at very tender age of ten. Through All India Sainik School Entrance Exam conducted under aegis of Sainik School Society, Ministry Of Defence to which a full-fledged medical check up follows, only 80 boys are admitted in class VI each year. The thrill on stepping the first step in this portal meant for their only dream of entry into NDA is a thrill beyond measure which everybody can't earn. Unlike public schools, the school doesn't prop and spoon feed by saying it a home away from the home but is harsh on ensuring their self-reliance and self-esteem, complying with its motto 'Dignity & Valour'.

From the very first day of their stay, rigorous NCC activities massively carried out under watchful eyes of three senior commissioned officers (not less than Major or Equivalent) and five non-commissioned officers forge in them unity and discipline. Thud of digging heels, rhythm of left-right- left and smack on but of the rifles from dawn to dusk of the day are simply too vibrant to ignore. Khakhi uniform is not an occasional wear but a charm in their dress code donned for all year along. Badges on the arms, feathers on

maroon beret and glittering stars & stripes bestowed on shoulders beckons what we call 'Pride of the Khakhi'. This is a practice to engender electrifying feel of officers in uniform. Moreover, It takes a school and an university for a boy to earn 'A' & 'B' certificate of NCC but here, they get in a school only which is no less than a testimony of the training standards imparted.

Unlike even residential public schools, Day of a Cadet breaks before the sun with chirrups of parrots who are, defacto, the aborigines of this sprawling 272 acres of land. While stamina & strength seeps during physical training of wee hours encompassing a four mile run and a many strengthening and stretching exercises, the school offers a spectrum of sports to choose from at the dawn. Football, volleyball, basketball, hockey, cricket, athletics, squash, table tennis, lawn tennis, badminton, equestrian sports, dive through glory rings of gymnastic and swimming in all formats are tools of school to let Cadets partake of a true sportsmanship. Yet, endurance elaborately seen in Cadets has a whole different story of stepping in.

Where the Cadets reside is eight squadrons and two holding houses for new entrants. It's here, through our carefully nurtured Chittorian camaraderie and legacy of sixty years, boys are transformed into Cadets, into a loyal junior and a responsible senior, into role models and friends forever, into master of the fate and captain of the soul. Each Squadron holds strength of fifty Cadets in a propionate mix of class VII-XII. Though everyone is amicable to one another and silence is rarely sensed, everyone live in pair. Each of them has a buddy detailed on very first day of their joining and remains so till they leave the portal. These buddy pairs wake up together, dine together, play together, study together, face all situations together and everything they do together. Not only junior

Cadets are streamlined to obey and respect but also their habits, mental health and actions are monitored. Morality is nurtured through integrated endeavours of senior Cadets through a time tested process of involving them into in situ actions and reactions. Senior Cadets beholding school & house appointments are responsible for carrying out school activities in its pristine glory so as to hone their effective intelligence, reasoning and planning & organizing capabilities. Hall mark of their bond is the training imparted in the house not during official hours but rest hours which ensures that seeds of endurance, mental and physical, sprouts and flower all around. Quality time spent on dining tables of spacious 'The Cadets' Mess'; during in and intra mural competitions like cross country where Cadets can easily be spotted carrying another at risk of his merit, in the secular space of celebrations, in the face of danger, in the spotlight of debate, drama and dance at house social, at school and at many more fronts develops an umbilical association with pillars of our foundation:- ' Devotion and Sacrifice in the name of the school, for the glory of mankind! This art of living together for seven years fosters social adaptability, group dynamism, liveliness, human values and a lot. It is this which cherishes rapport in our Chittorian family. You name a thing, they all jump to assist. Be that your classmate, the one who passed a half century ago or the esteemed generals of Indian defence forces.

Fine art of golden gratitude is professed through grace before and after each meal, before each sleep and of course community services solemnized on weekly basis in nearby places. Seminars, Excursions and Exchanges programmes of Cadets in universities are not only a respite but a way to experience practicality.

Another striking feature is no trace of counsellors anywhere in the annals of the school. What steadfast Cadets is the close proximity of the people whom they aspire to be.

Three commissioned officers (one colonel, one Lt. Col and one Major or equivalents of these) at administrative helm of the school are a living source of inspiration to them. Their interest in school and Cadets steer and spur for a better tomorrow. Perpetual visits of esteemed decorated officers and their suspiring tales of their legendary deeds keep this spark alive in them. Regimental setup from relieve to lights out in which they breathe in fuels this spark forever. Thus, Cadets are led by trendsetters itself not merely their tales told by someone else.

With all these in play, means of basic survival in the school is sound academics. A Cadet is expected to excel, besides his class curriculum, in public speaking for which not only they have eminent educators but also a myriad of debating opportunities at state and nationals. The school is a member of Indian Public School Conference (IPSC) and offers all that a public school do. Cultivation of extensive reading habits is ensured through a mandate of book review submission at the end of each week. Speaking and listening flair is honed through parliamentary debates on each Wednesday and dialogue delivery on each Saturday in respective classes at morning assembly time. Tone and tenor of the Cadets can be heard in the evening in school garden loudly reading the newspaper each day. For felicitating this process, the school caters a treasured library with more than 16000 books and magazines, multi equipped Dhramchakra English Labs and high speed internet connectivity in the library. Yet sole emphasis of trainers is on 'Right time, Right Place & Right Dress'.

What makes us unique is the balance between the multitudes of training imparted.

Strong foundation stones of Cadets stand test of time and this reflects in voluminous number of school alumni who have a count of more than six hundred officers in armed forces through NDA alone, in voluminous numbers who join



afresh each year the same and in the voluminous numbers who pursues other walks of life and leave a trail behind. This glorious transformation from a meek boy to a dignified & valiant officer with a nursery of tools and a class of infrastructure comes in a seven year stretch and the best part of it is 'at a cost within the reach of a common man (less than a lakh rupees)'; one of the prime objectives of the school.

At the end of the seven year stay, Cadets are incarnation of valiance and values, robust and

refreshed in the race of life, conscious and planned yet ability to grow never saturates; the virtue imbued to the imagery of 'A Chittorian Cadet'.

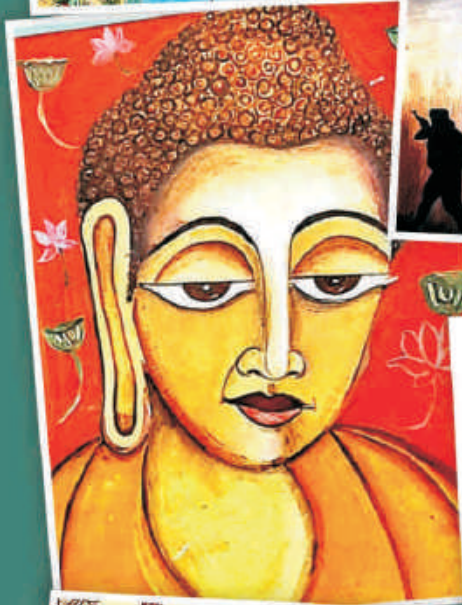

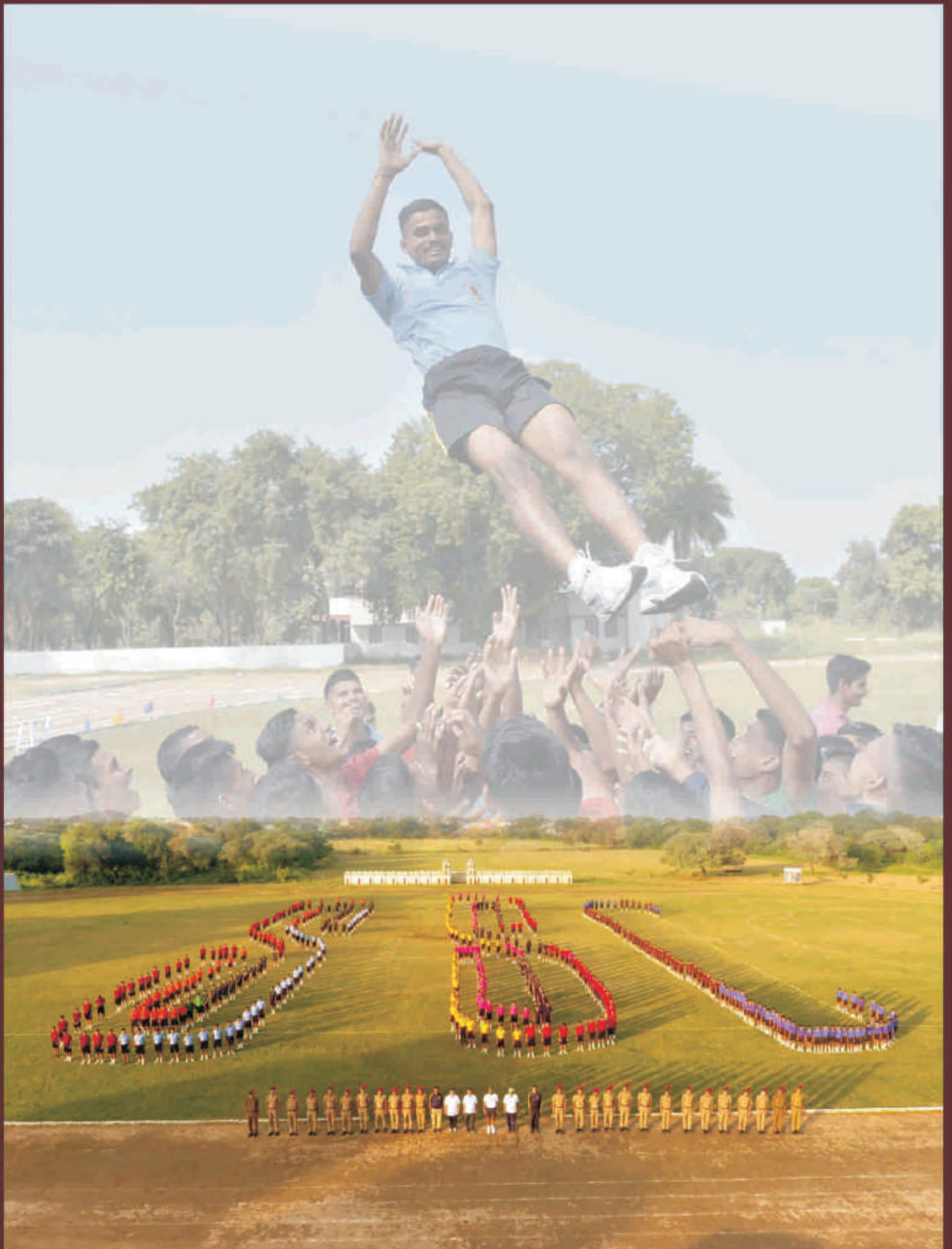
